Toys are the touchstones of childhood and are major collectibles in the antique and pop-culture markets. Most of the literature on toys deals with these aspects of the topic. Toys and American Culture is the first to approach toys in their cultural context. According to the preface, "Toys are the building blocks of society," and they reflect the cultural values of the time when they arose. This encyclopedia concentrates on the twentieth century, though some items from the nineteenth and twenty-first centuries are included as "bridges" to the past and future of toys. There is no attempt to be comprehensive in coverage but rather to focus on toys that are associated with imaginative play (puzzles and games are therefore excluded) and most tied to American culture. The encyclopedia has an A-Z format, with an alphabetical list of entries and a subject-delineated list of topics. Many of the more than 160 entries are for the toys themselves: Beanie Babies, Colorforms, Easy-Bake Oven, Hot Wheels, Marbles, and Shrinky Dinks are but a few examples. For each, the coverage includes the date that the toy was introduced, who designed the toy, how it was marketed, and how it has changed over the years. Thirty-one designers have entries of their own, including John Wright, son of Frank Lloyd Wright and the inventor of Lincoln Logs; Antonio Pasin, inventor of the little red wagon; and Richard Knerr, the founder of Wham-O. Major companies such as American Girl, Hasbro, and Tonka also have entries, as do special topics such as Made in China and Racist toys. Most entries include see also references and books, articles, and Web sites for further reading. The volume ends with a time line, a list of resources, and a comprehensive index.
